### THE HARRISON PRIZE

**To all undergraduates in their final year reading Biological subjects in  
Part II or Part III of their Tripos**

The late Professor Sir Richard Harrison MD FRS, a former Honorary Fellow of the College and Professor of Anatomy in the University, endowed a prize which is awarded each year for an outstanding Dissertation describing practical work in a Biological Subject carried out by a Downing undergraduate in their final year. Applicants for the prize are invited to supply an electronic copy of any dissertation to be submitted as part of this year's practical requirement (please note that BBS Dissertations are not eligible). The Dissertation will then be considered by a panel of Biological Fellows at Downing. A reference from each applicant's Project Supervisor is also required. The value of the prize is £100. Decisions will be made at Governing Body in June.

### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be made [online](#). The online process requires the completion of a personal, academic record and questionnaire section, as well as the upload of your dissertation.
